

# SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORTS 2002

## FOR THE MOTION PICTURE INDUSTRY PENSION, INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNT AND HEALTH PLANS

This is a summary of the annual report of the Motion Picture Industry Pension Plan, E.I.N. 95-1810805 (Plan No. 001), the Motion Picture Industry Individual Account Plan, E.I.N. 95-0030749 (Plan No. 002), and for the Motion Picture Industry Health Plan, E.I.N. 95-6042583 (Plan No. 501), for the Plan Year ended December 31, 2002.

These annual reports have been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

### **Basic Pension Plan Financial Statement**

Benefits under the Plan are provided through insurance and through a trust fund. Plan expenses were \$128,696,310. These expenses included \$12,847,480 in administrative expenses and \$115,848,830 in benefits paid to Participants and beneficiaries. A total of 56,230 persons were Participants in or beneficiaries of the Plan at the end of the Plan Year, although not all of these persons had yet earned the right to receive benefits.

The value of Plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the Plan, was \$1,564,820,718 as of December 31, 2002, compared to \$1,733,094,298 as of January 1, 2002. During the Plan Year, the Plan experienced a decrease in its net assets of \$168,273,580. This decrease includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of Plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the Plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year, or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The Plan had total loss of \$39,577,270 including employer contributions of \$76,953,704, Participant contributions of \$129,484, realized losses of \$76,877,862 from the sale of assets, losses from investments of \$79,623,694, net transfers from other plans of \$38,368,840, and other income of \$1,472,258.

### **Basic Individual Account Plan Financial Statement**

Benefits under the Plan are provided through insurance and through a trust fund. Plan expenses were \$40,884,239. These expenses included \$6,996,636 in administrative expenses and \$33,877,603 in benefits paid to or for Participants and beneficiaries. A total of 45,057 persons were Participants in or beneficiaries of the Plan at the

end of the Plan Year, although not all of these persons had yet earned the right to receive benefits.

The value of Plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the Plan, was \$982,674,571 as of December 31, 2002, compared to \$1,027,830,415 as of January 1, 2002. During the Plan Year, the Plan experienced a decrease in its net assets of \$45,155,844. This decrease includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of Plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the Plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year, or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The Plan had a total loss of \$4,271,605 including employer contributions of \$85,347,487, realized losses of \$61,092,179 from the sale of assets, losses from investments of \$29,619,651, net transfers from other plans of \$5,445, and other income of \$1,087,293.

### **Minimum Pension and Individual Account Plans Funding Standards**

An actuary's statement shows that enough money was contributed to the Plans to keep them funded in accordance with the minimum funding standards of ERISA.

### **Health Plan-Insurance Information**

The Plan has contracts with The Union Labor Life Insurance Company, Private Medical Care, United Concordia Dental Plans of California, Smile Saver Dental Plan, Kaiser Permanente, Oxford Health Plans, Health Net, Vision Service Plan, and Blue Cross of California to provide certain medical, dental, vision, and life insurance benefits incurred under the terms of the Plan. The total premiums paid for the Plan Year ending December 31, 2002 was \$31,256,308.



Because they are so called “experience-rated” contracts, the premium costs are affected by, among other things, the number and size of claims. Of the total insurance premiums paid for the Plan Year ended December 31, 2002, the premiums paid under such “experience-rated” contracts were \$1,797,244 and the total of all benefit claims paid under these experience-rated contracts during the Plan year was \$1,624,947.

### Basic Health Plan Financial Statement

The value of Plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the Plan, was \$77,985,816 as of December 31, 2002, compared to \$78,225,133 as of January 1, 2002. During the Plan Year, the Plan experienced a decrease in its net assets of \$239,317. This decrease includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of Plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the Plan’s assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. During the Plan Year, the Plan had total income of \$365,768,873 including employer contributions of \$340,981,558, Participant contributions of \$4,828,235, realized losses of \$10,740,989 from the sale of assets, earnings from investments of \$19,405,574, net transfers from other plans of \$10,995,851, and other income of \$298,644.

Plan expenses were \$366,008,190. These expenses included \$19,771,935 in administrative expenses and \$346,236,255 in benefits paid to Participants and beneficiaries.

1. An independent auditors’ report;
2. Financial information and information on payments to service providers;
3. Assets held for investment;
4. Transactions in excess of 5% of each Plans’ assets;

5. Insurance information, including sales commissions paid by insurance carriers;
6. Information regarding any common or collective trusts, pooled separate accounts, master trusts or 103-12 investment entities in which the Plan participates (Pension and IAP only);
7. Actuarial information regarding the funding of the Plan (Pension only).

If you request a copy of the full annual report(s) from the Plan administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report. The charge to cover copying costs given above does not include a charge for the copying of these portions of the report(s) because these portions are furnished without charge.

You also have the legally protected right to examine the annual report at the main office of the Plan, Motion Picture Industry Pension & Health Plans, 11365 Ventura Boulevard, Studio City, CA 91604-3148, and at the U.S. Department of Labor in Washington, D.C., or to obtain a copy from the U.S. Department of Labor upon payment of copying costs.
